Among the gems of Northern Italy, Lake Como captivates with breathtaking landscapes and historic villas. A stop in Bellagio is a must—an elegant village suspended between water and sky, where nature and sophistication blend into a truly unique experience.

Lake Como, nestled among the Lombard Alps, is one of the most enchanting places in Italy. Located in Lombardy, about an hour from Milan, it is easily accessible by train, car, or ferry. Of glacial origin, the lake amazes with its deep, crystal-clear waters reflecting the surrounding mountain peaks. Its shores are lined with historic villas set in lush gardens, botanical parks, and picturesque villages. Among them stands out Bellagio, known as the “Pearl of the Lario,” an elegant village perched at the meeting point of the lake’s three branches. Its cobbled streets, panoramic terraces, and timeless charm make it a must-visit destination.

Bellagio, an ancient village overlooking the meeting point of Lake Como’s three branches, has Roman origins and a charm that spans centuries. Easily reached by car, ferry, or bus from Como and Lecco, it captivates with its elegance, blooming gardens, and stone stairways. Strolling among boutiques, visiting Villa Melzi, or getting lost in its narrow alleys is a true delight. On the lake, you can enjoy kayaking, sailing, or boat tours. After these activities, relax at one of the lakeside restaurants and savor local specialties like perch risotto, missultin (dried lake fish), and polenta taragna. An experience of beauty, flavor, and tranquility.

If you have only one day for your vacation, Villa Melzi is an absolute must-visit. Villa Melzi, an elegant neoclassical residence overlooking Lake Como in Bellagio, was built between 1808 and 1810 for Francesco Melzi d’Eril, Vice President of the Italian Republic under Napoleon. Surrounded by beautiful English-style gardens, it features statues, exotic plants, and breathtaking lake views. The villa itself is not open to the public, but the gardens and museum are accessible from March to October. An entrance ticket is required and can also be purchased online. The property still belongs to the Melzi family descendants, who carefully maintain it. A place where art, history, and nature blend in perfect harmony.
