## The 39th Venice Marathon: an Ethiopian and Sporting Triumph

Italy-Stra (Venice), 30.10.2025 [ENA]

On Sunday, October 26, 2025, Venice hosted the 39th edition of the Venice Marathon, one of the most iconic and captivating races on the international running scene. Starting from Villa Pisani in Stra and finishing at Riva Sette Martiri. The marathon offered over 7,000 runners an unforgettable journey

This year's edition paid tribute to the 300th anniversary of Giacomo Casanova's birth, a legendary figure of Venetian culture. The homage was reflected in the event's visual setup, custom-designed medals, and a series of cultural and sporting side events that turned the entire week into a vibrant celebration.

The men's race was dominated by Ethiopian runner Deribe Robi, who crossed the finish line in 2:08:58, marking the seventh-fastest time in Venice Marathon history. Robi surged ahead on the Ponte della Libertà, distancing his rivals and finishing solo under light rain and rising acqua alta.

In the women's race, Ethiopia's Ashumar Zebenay claimed victory with a time of 2:27:31, creating a significant gap over her competitors. Despite a fall near the end, she maintained her lead and crossed the finish line with determination, confirming Ethiopia's dominance in both categories.

With over 20,000 registrants and 60 nationalities represented, the Venice Marathon reaffirmed its status as a global event, attracting elite and amateur runners alike for its stunning route, high-quality organization, and the unique charm of Venice. Behind the scenes, the event was flawlessly managed: from safety and logistics to refreshment stations and medical support. Over 1,000 volunteers contributed to its success, showcasing passion and professionalism. Live coverage on Rai Sport allowed millions to follow the race in

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real time.

The Venice Marathon strengthened its commitment to environmental sustainability, using recyclable materials, reducing plastic waste, and promoting green mobility. The event also included para-athletic races and charity initiatives, raising funds for local associations through its Charity Program. The marathon capped off a weekend full of activities: the VM10K and Venice Half Marathon engaged thousands more, with staggered starts from Mestre and Piazza Ferretto. The Expo Village featured booths, music, tastings, and family-friendly entertainment, turning Venice into a true sports capital.

Athletes crossing bridges, alleys, and squares created postcard-worthy scenes. Piazza San Marco, the Grand Canal, and Ponte della Libertà served as breathtaking backdrops. Photographers and drones captured epic moments, widely shared across social media.

GidiferroTeam, with Mario Bonesi and the stunning Beatrice Tomada, filmed the full start in Stra and met the radiant contestants of Miss Riviera del Brenta, led by the beautiful Elisa Enache and patron Renato Trincanato.
